

MANURE HAULERS/BROKERS MEETINGS IN SNYDER COUNTY

MIDDLEBURG – Penn State University’s College of Agricultural Sciences, with help from the Snyder County Conservation District (SCCD), will host two winter meetings for manure haulers and manure brokers. Both meetings will be on Tuesday, February 12, 2019, at the SCCD Office’s basement conference room, located at 10541 Route 522, Middleburg, PA.

The morning workshop, which runs from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, is for all manure haulers and brokers. Topics include manure hauler/broker program updates, industry survey results, manure gas safety, reviewing manure application setbacks, winter and early spring application concerns, and spotted lanternfly permitting.

The afternoon workshop, running from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., is targeted for those who hold “Manure Broker Level 2” certification and are trained to write Act 49 nutrient balance sheets (NBS). Items of discussion are record keeping updates, NBS submission requirements, how to sample “co-mingled” manures, and using the most recent NBS spreadsheets.

Attendees who stay for the end of each workshop will receive PA Department of Agriculture sponsored 3.0 Continuing Education Credits (CECs) for their certification.
