<b>Norway Spruce</b> <i>Picea abies</i>	180'	Evergreen Tree	This conifer is a fast grower and is an excellent windbreak as well as an ornamental tree. Dark green needles with long cones. Stately tree.
<b>American Persimmon</b> <i>Diospyros Virginiana</i>	25-40'	Fruit bearing Tree	With very few disease and pest problems, this tree produces fruit starting in the fall and sometimes lasting into the winter. Great for wildlife. Fruit is best eaten when soft. Should have 2 trees to pollinate. Very strong wood.
<b>Paw Paw</b> <i>Asimina triloba</i>	12-25'	Deciduous Tree	Plant at least two trees for pollination. Also known as "poor mans' banana" since the edible fruit tastes like banana/mango. Grows up to 25 ft. Likes deep, well drained, slightly acidic soil. Native tree.
<b>Red Oak</b> <i>Quercus alba</i>	60-70'	Deciduous Tree	This oak prefers slightly acidic to neutral, deep, moist, well-drained soil. Plant the tree in full sun or partial shade. This is a long lived tree that is beneficial to wildlife. Can grow 12"-24" per year. Great shade tree. Very strong wood.
<b>Winterberry</b> <i>Ilex verticillata</i>	6-12'	Deciduous Shrub	The persistent bright red female fruit of this holly shrub make it very popular for landscaping. It is recommended for planting in shady moist areas, even though its growth and form are best under open grown conditions. Grows to a height of 6-12'. A native plant that likes acid soils. Great for wildlife.
<b>Honey Crisp Apple</b>	10-15'	Fruit Tree	A crisp, juicy sweet-tart apple that is orange-red with a yellow background. Good winter hardiness. Harvest early to mid-September. Long storage time. <u>Need 2 to pollinate.</u> Great eating apple.
<b>Fuji Apple</b>	10-15'	Fruit Tree	A cross between 2 American apples – Delicious and Genet - they contain between 9-11% sugars by weight and have a dense flesh that is sweeter and crispier than many other apple varieties. A long shelf life, even without refrigeration. <u>Should have two to pollinate.</u> Good pollinators are Gala and Granny Smith.
<b>Red Haven Peach</b>	10-15'	Fruit Tree	A late bloomer with almost fuzzless skin, this peach is a heavy bearer and is good for eating fresh or canning. Ripens in late July. Freestone and <u>self-pollinating.</u>
<b>Shiitake Mushroom Logs</b>	6' Log		These are logs that are inoculated with mushroom spawn. Every shiitake log will produce 3 harvests of mushrooms every 16 days. Some customers report a 4th or even 5th flush of mushrooms. Instructions come with orders.
<b>Hops-Cascade</b>	Vine	Rhizome	Grows quickly in a well-drained sunny location. A vine that produces cones used in the making of home brew. Should be trained on a fence or trellis.
<b>Bluecrop Blueberry</b>	4-6'	Bare Root	Consistent yields, large fruit, and disease resistant. Is self-pollinating and likes full sun. Blooms in May. Planting two increases production.
<b>Seascape Strawberry</b>	#1 Plants	Bare Root	This Day Neutral Strawberry Plant bears fruit 12-14 weeks after planting. The plants have the potential to be the most productive of any day-neutral. The berries are large, firm and have good flavor when picked ripe from the plant. Produces continuously throughout the summer and early fall.
<b>Dianthus—Firewitch</b>	1 Quart	Perennial	Easily grown in average, medium, well-drained soil in full sun. Prefers slightly alkaline soils. This hybrid tolerates heat and humidity (as well as some drought) better than most species of dianthus. Remove spent flowers to promote continued bloom. Grows 4-6 inches tall spreading 6-12". Brilliant magenta color.
<b>All Perennial Mix</b>	Varies	15 Seed Varieties	Maltese Cross, Gayfeather/Blazing Star, Shasta Daisy, Sweet William, Foxglove, Candytuft, Purple Cornflower, Lance Leaf Coreopsis, Blanketflower, Black Eyed Susan, Perennial Lupine, Siberian Wallflower, Blue Flax, Gloriosa Daisy, Mexican Hat.
<b>Poppy Power</b>	Varies	8 Seed Varieties	Mix contains Oriental Poppy (P), Red Poppy (Shirley Mix-A), Iceland Poppy (A/P), Red Corn Poppy (American Red Legion—A), California Poppy (White Linen A/P), California Poppy (Red Mikado A/P), California Poppy (Mixed Colors A/P), California Poppy (Orange A/P). A-Annual P-Perennial A/P—Both
<b>Court Jester Marigold</b>	Up to 20"	One Variety	Reminiscent of the striped costumes of the sprightliest member of the court, Court Jester French Marigolds feature a bold red/brown and yellow pattern. One half ounce covers 45 square feet.
<b>Ginseng Seed</b> <i>(Panax quinquefolius)</i>	12-24"	Wood Grown	Woods-cultivated ginseng grown from seed will require at least five years to yield a marketable product. The best time to plant is fall or very early spring. Ginseng is shade obligate and requires tree and/or shrub coverage of 60 to 90 percent shade, preferably a site facing north or east. Best soils are loamy, moist, well drained, high in organic matter, and slightly acidic.
<b>Tree Tube</b>	2' & 3'	Tube with Stake	Tree tubes are great for protecting trees from deer, rabbits and reducing moisture stress. Comes with stakes & ties. Go to plantra.com for more info
<b>Rain Barrel</b>		55 Gal. Plastic Barrel	All parts are included except for a needed S shaped adaptor to hook into the downspout. Stores water from roof runoff in the 55 gallon drum for later use.
<b>Bluebird Box</b>		Unpainted Bluebird Box	Constructed of pine this birdhouse is to be painted a light color and placed on a post 4-5' high to keep away from predators. Keep boxes 200-300' apart.
<b>Soil Test Kit</b>		1 bag	The kit contains a plastic bag with instructions and a mailer. This kit allows the gardener or landscaper to take a soil sample and mail it in to the PSU lab.
<b>Tree Planting bar</b>	3' tall	Welded Steel	This planting bar is used for planting tree seedlings with a small root structure. A slit is made by pushing the steel wedge into the soil to place the seedling followed by another slit beside it to push the hole shut.
