



Snyder-Juniata County Kids' Enviro-Camp Held in Richfield



From June 17 - 19, 2024, a Kids' Enviro-Camp was at Richfield's Basom Park, co-hosted by the Snyder County (SCCD) and Juniata County (JCCD) Conservation Districts. An average of forty (40) children attended the camp each evening.

Each day's events were held from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m., featuring special guests. Children entering 1st through 4th grade were split into four groups named after official Pennsylvania state flora and fauna: Fireflies, Ruffed Grouse, Mountain Laurel and Hellbenders.

Highlights included:

- Viewing a live bear trapped by the PA Game Commission,
- Understanding what is involved in stream assessments,
- How to cast a fly-fishing and regular fishing rod,
- What are hellbenders and their habitat needs,
- Painting their own t-shirts to take home and making their own water cycle bracelets. Also,
- Learn about forestry & wood products, raising trout, and boating safety, and
- How people can prevent streams from being polluted.

Wednesday was Family Community Night, in which children and their parents and guardians viewed photos of the week's events, participated in three presentations, and enjoyed ice cream floats.
